ABOUT SUNSET, 0639 HOURS

On January 2, 1938, American pilot Captain Edwin Musick embarked on a long-forgotten historical flight – the inaugural airmail service from New Zealand to the United States.

Piloting the Samoan Clipper, one of Pan America's Sikorsky S-42B flying boats, he and six crew members traversed 4,000 miles of open ocean. From Auckland they stopped in Pago Pago in American Samoa and again at Kingman Reef, then on to Honolulu, where a connecting flight completed the mail run to San Francisco.

On June 11,1938, Captain Musick and his crew departed again for New Zealand, carrying mail from the United States. However, shortly after taking off from Pago Pago, the last point before New Zealand, the Samoan Clipper tragically exploded mid-air in a blast that could be heard for miles. The ocean was littered with oil, burnt mail and plane wreckage. The bodies of the captain and his crew were never recovered, and the airmail service was suspended until July 1940.

Sunset, o639 Hours brings to life this forgotten story in a reimagined narrative that follows each leg of Musick's journey. It is a story of fearlessness, island paradise, isolation, loss and longing set in the pre-WWII cabaret days of New Zealand, Samoa and Hawaii. It celebrates the daring accomplishments of an early aviation hero and his crew who risked their lives in order to connect the people of two distant lands.

MATTHEW NEENAN (Co-Creater and Choreographer)

Matthew Neenan began his dance training at the Boston Ballet, and later attended the LaGuardia High School of Performing Arts and the School of American Ballet in New York. From 1994-2007, Matthew danced with the Pennsylvania Ballet, where he danced numerous Principal roles in the classical, contemporary, and Balanchine repertoire. In October 2007, Matthew was named Choreographer in Residence at the Pennsylvania Ballet.

Matthew's choreography has been featured and performed by the Pennsylvania Ballet, BalletX, The Washington Ballet, Ballet West, Colorado Ballet, Ballet Memphis, Milwaukee Ballet, Oregon Ballet Theatre, Tulsa Ballet and Juilliard Dance, among many others. He has received numerous awards and grants for his choreography from the National Endowment of the Arts, Dance Advance funded by the Pew Charitable Trusts, and the Choo San Goh Foundation. He received the New York City Ballet's Choreographic Institute's Fellowship Initiative Award in 2006, and was also the first recipient of the Jerome Robbins NEW Program Fellowship. In 2005, Matthew co-founded BalletX with Christine Cox. BalletX has toured and performed Neenan's choreography, most notably at the Vail Dance Festival, The Joyce Theater, Laguna Dance Festival, Spring to Dance Festival and internationally in Cali, Colombia, and Seoul, South Korea.

BALLETX

BalletX, Philadelphia's premier contemporary ballet, whose dancers were named "among America's best" by *The New York Times*, commissions choreographers from around the world to create dance that is "fresh, inclusive, and connects to what people want" (*Philadelphia Citizen*) while "positioning Philadelphia on the cutting edge of contemporary ballet" (*The Dance Journal*). Founded in 2005 by Christine Cox and Matthew Neenan, BalletX is led by Cox, whose tenure as Artistic & Executive Director has produced over 100 world premiere ballets by nearly 60 choreographers, a record "few companies can match," according to *The New York Times*. Under Cox's leadership, BalletX has been hailed as an "epicenter of

creation" (*Dance Magazine*) and "place of choreographic innovation" (*The New Yorker*), putting Philadelphia on the map as an international destination for contemporary ballet. Learn more at www.BalletX.org.
